## Northern Virginia EMS Council

Board of Directors Minutes – October 20, 2022

### *Approval of Minutes*

Minutes from the NVEMSC Board of Directors held on September 15, 2022, were sent for review by email

- Beth Adams made a motion to accept the minutes with the corrections above, seconded by Rick Cohen
- The minutes were **unanimously approved**.

### *Treasurer's Report*

Laura Vandegrift provided the following report in the absence of Keith Morrison:

- The financials for September 2022 were sent via email before the meeting.
  - Beth Adams made a motion to accept the financial reports as submitted, seconded by Mark Kordalski
  - The Treasurer's Report and financials were **unanimously approved**
- The draft audit report has been sent to Ray and Laura from the auditor and they have been reviewing it with the auditor
  - There were a few deficiencies found but those are recognized as being due to the transition from Ambassador Accounting back to in-house bookkeeping and payroll
- Following up on last month's report, Truist has agreed that the credit card rewards were redeemed fraudulently and have credited us for the \$480
- We are looking into options for high-yield money market accounts to transfer all or part of our current Truist money market account to
  - Truist earns 0.01% and others such as Apple FCU earn 0.40%
  - We are researching and will report back at a future board meeting

### *President's Report*

President Anne Marsh advised of the following:

- Ray Whatley started officially with the Council full-time on Monday, October 17, 2022
- She is working with Craig Evans and GWU still on getting the community paramedic program set for the fall of 2023
- EMS Symposium is next month in Norfolk and she has given her slot to another member of her department who may have better use for the education

### *Executive Director's Report*

Ray Whatley, Acting Executive Director provided the following report in his absence:

- The Council Workplan was discussed at the Regional Executive Directors meeting on October 18th. I am very happy with the results.
  - We will report the changes once we have received the final work plan. It will go into effect on January 1, 2023.
  - The Council contract extension was granted until December 31, 2022.
- All regional awards were delivered. Award winners should have received an email from OEMS to RSVP by October 22 if they plan to attend the awards banquet. If you are an award winner and did not receive the email contact, Tristen Graves. (if asked it was sent from [rr.VDH-emstechasst@vdh.virginia.gov](mailto:rr.VDH-emstechasst@vdh.virginia.gov).)
- Ray was appointed by the Regional Executive Directors group to the transportation committee. They met on October 3 and reviewed and scored 39 grant applications.
  - Please make sure your grant packages are complete
  - Be sure your need is clear and fully explained

- If it's a regional project have letters of support from the region
- Vehicles continue to be granted extensions due to supply shortages
- We have received calls and emails inquiring about the Council screening and/or hiring screeners for the Ebola outbreak and incoming travelers to Dulles Airport. At this time, we do not have a contract and haven't been approached about one. All screening is being done by CDC staff at Dulles.

### **Stroke Smart Advocate Report**

Margaret Probst provided the following report:

- The Town of Purcellville has finally reached out and will be announcing its proclamation the last week of October
- Fairfax County is next/last on the list of localities to complete the proclamation
- She is meeting with Fairfax's Area Agency on Aging director today to hopefully bring the training to her staff.
- She met last week with Fairfax's Park Authority Deputy Director Sara Baldwin and has her support/approval to train her staff and is meeting with Ms. Baldwin's training manager later today to schedule dates.
- She's traveling to Centerville to provide an in-person Stroke Smart training session to Fairfax's CERT (the first of 2 in-person and 4 virtual sessions for that group). I've been invited to speak to the entire group during their monthly meeting, which starts after the training session for 8 minutes to describe the program and get more attendance and commitment to spreading the information.
- She's meeting with C. Grassman this afternoon to discuss how to tailor the program for the blind and visually impaired.
- She has approval from Fairfax libraries and has scheduled training there.
- Greg Hendershot (Arlington Fire) has connected her with the library's director and parks and rec director and she's in the initial stages of scheduling training with those departments.
- She presented in person to Prince William's HR department on Friday.
- Stephanie Williams, creator and executive producer of the TV show "Panorama Latina" which airs locally on Comcast wants to interview Margaret to bring Stroke Smart to the Hispanic community
  - This is exciting to bring this to this community which has a higher stroke risk than other populations
- Margaret got an email from the Deputy Director for PW Public Libraries about a follow-up on their training and stroke recognition. It read:

*Hello Margaret,*

*I want to sincerely thank you for doing this training with our staff. Just a couple of days ago we had a staff member displaying symptoms of a stroke. She and I both realized it thanks to your training. Staff called 911 immediately and they took her to Sentara. She was experiencing mini strokes and had at least three more while she was in the hospital. Because we, the EMT's, and*

*doctors acted so quickly, she has not sustained any brain damage. We sincerely thank you!! You probably saved her life!*

## STATE AND REGIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTS

### *AHA Training Center*

Ray Whatley provided the following report:

- **Reminder: Paper Instructor Cards Invalid Soon**

The AHA would like to remind the Training Network that the last date for paper Instructor cards to be issued was December 2020 for BLS and January 2021 for ACLS, PALS, and Heartsaver. Paper Instructor cards will not be valid after December 2022 for BLS and January 2023 for HS, ACLS, and PALS. Any current paper Instructor cards are valid until that time. As noted in the Course Card Reference Guide, the paper cards will be phased out and discontinued on the dates below.

- BLS Instructor Printed Card Quality Control Checkpoints:
  - Not valid after December 31, 2022
  - Last date to issue: December 31, 2020
- ACLS & PALS:
  - Not valid after January 31, 2023
  - Last date to issue: January 31, 2021
- HeartSaver:
  - January 2023 Quality Control Checkpoints
    - Not valid after January 31, 2023
    - Last date to issue: January 31, 2021

### State EMS Advisory Board

Beth Adams provided the following written report:

- The legislation & Planning Committee met on September 23
  - Completed 2023-25 OEMS Strategic Plan
  - Approved talking points re: “EMS as essential service” (shared via email on 10/3)
    - advised since then by Brian Hricik that VAGEMSA is working on a draft to provide language regarding EMS as an essential service to be included in the Public Safety Stakeholders legislative agenda.
- Rules & Regs Committee met on October 5
  - Reviewing final draft - new administration’s process steps will slow the process moving forward
  - Board of Pharmacy
    - Controlled Substance Registration (CSR) required
    - only 2 inspectors
    - They have set up a dedicated email address for EMS agencies

### *Trauma PI Committee*

Dr. Morgan advised of the following:

- No meeting since the last BOD meeting
- The meeting is on December 14th,
  - Pedestrian struck is the trauma topic

### *Medevac Committee*

Rick Cohen provided the following:

- No meeting since the last BOD meeting, their next meeting is a week or 2 after the symposium

### *Regional Medical Directors & State Medical Direction Committee*

Dr. Morgan provided the following update:

- State Medical Direction Committee met on 10/6 in Richmond
  - Trauma medical director Dr. Daria from Loudoun is now the state rep at the meeting
  - Added H2 blockers IV to the Scope of Practice
  - They had a presentation and a good discussion on chest needle decompression for tension pneumothorax in the field
    - Observed anecdotally overly aggressive chest decompression with lack of appropriate symptoms, working to increase awareness and focus training on indications and appropriate symptoms, reduction of injuries from the procedure, etc.
      - Not much data to conclude from but good discussion from all
  - Discussion on regional issues
    - They discussed Ebola and that Dulles would be receiving incoming international travelers
      - Nothing more than the previous VDH updates
    - Sentara NVMC and delayed entry to ED with ambulance transports
      - This has the attention of OEMS and the state medical director and has been taken to the GAB
      - It is the understanding that an EMTALA complaint has been filed
      - OEMS staff was both engaged and concerned about this topic
        - They did find, through their discussion at this meeting, that this does occasionally happen at other hospitals in the state so there is an interest and a bigger look to get this addressed
- The monthly regional OMD/EMS leadership meeting follows this meeting today at noon

### *Training and Certification Committee*

Michelle Ludeman provided the following report:

- The committee met on Wednesday, October 5, 2022

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- Regional EMS Councils: The Tidewater (TEMS) Council rolled out its “Whole Blood Initiative” this week.
- 2021 NEMSES Rollouts
  - 5 rollouts (128 educators have attended) have been conducted so far with the next scheduled for this Friday.
- Education Coordinator Candidate Program
  - 690 certified ECs in Virginia.
  - 210 candidates in the process.
  - 9 are eligible for the next institute with a deadline of mid-December
  - 65 have not completed any requirements
  - 175 have not taken the NREMT examination
    - This remains the number one hold-up for candidates to be eligible for the institute. Results are not regularly reported to OEMS; therefore, don’t delay if you’re trying to meet deadlines for an invitation to the Institute
  - Fredericksburg Institute – 26 new ECs certified. This was the most prepared group of candidates they have seen. The addition of the 10 hours of Administrative function has affected the outcome of the institute.
  - They are only holding 4 EC updates next year across the Commonwealth.
- Symposium
  - Over 1000 registered thus far.
  - 1500-1600 are expected with the last-minute rush we see every year.
  - We did have a glitch with some courses. Previous courses had limits removed because of the lecture-based requirements of COVID. This allowed over-enrollment in limited classes which required OEMS to remove some enrollments.
- EMS for Children –
  - Agencies that need child restraints for their ambulances, contact Dave Edwards for them.
  - EMSC is in the final year of federal funding – any recommendations for use would be welcome.
- BLS Psychomotor Competency Verification Guidance for Legal Recognition, Reentry & Challenge
  - A Scenario Toolkit is at the printers for distribution at a future date.
  - This is to help offset the workload on the educator side for the 5 & 5 simulation requirements for EMT clinical competencies.
  - This is a validated process for candidates working towards legal recognition, reentry, and challenge through a scenario-based testing process.
  - These are basic, realistic, and appropriate scenarios for the expectation of a provider.
- The NREMT IOOH evaluation form was obtained and converted for Virginia OEMS use.
  - The form has an evaluation tool with the documentation required for each score obtained. These forms are transmitted to OEMS for grading and review.
- Their next meeting will be in January 2023

### *Patient Tracking Workgroup*

Jamie Cooper provided the following update:

- There have been no meetings in the last month and with the exit of Craig Evans, he has been working with Adam Buckley and Ray on this
- They have narrowed it down to 2 of the 3 candidates for a tracker

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- Craig French said Inova, as a system, is poised to make a pitch to support Pulsara to their corporate/financial people, just one of many hospital systems used in NOVA, but this may give us additional talking points for the workgroup
- He will have a new report next month after their next meeting
- He can field questions on this workgroup if you have any

EMS Battalion Chief Anne Marsh provided the following update:

- Recruits are in school now, but they lost 2 due to not passing the fire module
- They are down to 22 in class currently
- ALS providers are moving through and they should have 10 in the fall and 6 in the pipeline next
- The concept keeps coming up to have 2 ALS providers on medic units and none on suppression units, but she is opposed and trying to be progressive like other departments
- Telehealth is going well and they have opened it up to surrounding Fire/EMS partners
  - If you have questions, please talk to Anne or Dr. Smith
  - They won't be able to use their ET3 ability but can use their telehealth providers in consultation, etc.

### ***City of Fairfax Fire Department***

Brian Orndoff advised of the following:

- Still recruiting and they have some retirements coming up
  - Alex Fitch is leaving after 25 years and will become the Emergency Manager for Leesburg

### ***Fairfax County Fire & Rescue***

Mark Kordalski provided the following update:

- 1 recruit school recently graduated and another is in EMT school now which is going well
- They are still deciding on converting units in the next 3-6 months to 4 transport and 3-4 AFRs

### ***Fairfax County Police Helicopter Division***

Paul DeHaven provided the following updates:

- Move-in date to West Ox has moved back again and will now likely be after the first of the year

### *Loudoun County Fire and Rescue*

EMS Battalion Chief Jamie Cooper provided the following updates:

- Recruit school in session currently
- They are working through the next iteration of AEMT classes
  - Kate Kramer asked how they are using their AEMTs
    - The mid-level program never went away, they transitioned from ST to Enhanced but then transitioned into the AEMT and took their prior ST or E protocols and made them fit better to the national standard and state SOP for AEMT
      - The hurdle is the messaging from dispatch and they had to change dispatch protocols to fully utilize the capacity of the AEMT, and are still tweaking those protocols as they should be able to handle 90% of ALS calls and reserve Paramedic level skills and or meds where otherwise needed
        - They are accurately dispatching AEMTs in the 30-40% range, they are shooting for mid-60% to keep Paramedic resources available in chase vehicles or upfitting to ALS-compatible engines
        - Haven't had an attrition issue with paramedics in Loudoun, their issue is that due to staffing models, when internally promoting a FF/P to a technician, they lose the ability to put them in a minimum staff position
- Just completed registry testing for the first AEMT to P class
  - All 10 passed NREMT
  - 2 joined the class from Fauquier
  - All 10 candidates were happy to have the introduction to ALS via AEMT first, and many didn't realize at first why there was such a difference between the AEMT and P curriculum
    - From the instructor aspect, this was probably the strongest group of ALS candidates due to base knowledge/background
    - Hats off to the academy staff and candidates for being the first of their type for the bridge
- They are sending a full contingent to Symposium next month
- In another first for Loudoun, they have an accelerated recruit school starting soon
  - They had 110 applicants with a fire and/or EMS certification already
    - They are reviewing applicants now
  - This reduces the normal recruit school from 26 weeks

### ***OEMS Program Representative***

Chris Vernovai provided the following update:

- Working on the Council work plan, they last met on Tuesday 10/18
  - Currently working on a 4.5-year contract due to a 6-month extension and it will be up for renewal in 2027
  - They're looking forward to the ability of each Council to emphasize what they're working on in each region
- EMS Symposium is next month and as of Tuesday 1757 registrations
  - The awards banquet will be Saturday night
- Any agencies that are doing mobile integrated health/community paramedicine, need letters of intent to be submitted to the state
  - Only 4 received statewide
    - They just need for tracking purposes on who is doing what
    - It's on the website and the Council can send this out as well if needed
      - Anything that is not traditional 911 such as telehealth, home visits, etc.
        - It's laid out on the application
- Over half of all ALS agencies in the state have signed on for HandTevy,
  - If you're not signed up yet, please reach out to Chris to get that set up

### ***PHI Aircare***

Rick Cohen advised of the following:

- PHI went through national restructuring and took 6 regions and made those into 3 but that doesn't change things for them

### ***Physicians Transport Service***

Kate Passow advised of the following:

- Getting ready for the potential transport of Ebola
- Transporting sick kids all over VA as hospitals locally are full here

### ***Inova Health System***

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Craig French advised of the following update:

- Regarding the earlier discussion on patient tracking and Pulsara, the neuroscience service line has been pursuing Pulsara for a year or so now
  - There is a meeting tomorrow for all major service lines and others to pitch it to financial services within Inova due to the large financial commitment on this as this will be for the whole system, not just IFMC
  - One plus is that it integrates well with EPIC hospital EMR and the neuro folks are looking into AI Doc (using VIZ now) but will also interface with Pulsara well
- Peds has been a popular patient category lately
  - In ER alone, their census board is on red for Pedi ED and bursting at the seams
  - Adult ERs are taking some younger people to accommodate the volume
  - Hospitals have added inpatient hospital beds
- You may see a tent added at Fairfax for added waiting room space again due to the increase in volume
- Capacity is through the roof the last week or so
  - Census exceeded several days in a row
  - All have overflow space that is open currently for about a few hundred beds but still staffing issues so including charge nurses, etc., to the mix
- They have made an offer and it was accepted for the Fairfax Hospital EMS Liaison
  - Steven King recently retired from PG County FD and will start on November 4th
- Inova will be at EMS Symposium
  - Dr. Place will do EMS Children lectures and Dr. Ferrada doing trauma
  - They also have a booth and sponsorship

- Reston will be doing an internal MCI Drill Thursday, October 27<sup>th</sup>.
- ED holds have increased
