GUESTS

Call to Order

Council President Nate Strong welcomed all in attendance and called the meeting to order at 10:04 am

- No representatives from the public requested to address the Board.

Approval of Minutes

The NVEMSC Board of Directors meeting minutes on September 19, 2024, were emailed for review.

- John Wanamaker made a motion to accept as written, seconded by Beth Adams.
- The minutes were **unanimously approved**.

Treasurer's Report

The financial reports for September were sent via email for review.

- Beth Adams made a motion to approve the financials as submitted, seconded by Jamie Cooper.
- The financials were **unanimously approved**.

President's Report

President Nate Strong advised he had no report for today's meeting.

- He is working with NVERS on the merger.

Executive Director's Report

Interim Executive Director Laura Vandegrift submitted the following report:

- **OEMS Funding**
 - All outstanding quarterly contract payments are up to date. The FY25 Q1 report and supporting documents will be submitted next week.
- **Medication Kit Transition Update**
 - On October 9, 2024, the FDA released a document entitled "DSCSA Exemptions from Section 582 (d)(1) and Other Requirements of the FD&C Act for Certain Trading Partners." While everyone is still reviewing the document, we believe this may give the hospitals the "cover" they need to continue the current regional EMS medication kit restocking program for a short time beyond the previous November 27, 2024, deadline. While this is good news, it certainly does not allow us to cease or even slow down our efforts to transition to a new EMS medication resupply process. On October 9, 2024, the Regional EMS Councils also became aware of a DEA announcement that they would announce the final rule for the Protecting Patient Access to Emergency Medication Act (PPAEMA) in December of 2024. If that occurs, another deadline will impact the transition. Your Regional EMS Councils will keep you posted on developments. We also continue to stand by and assist any agency with applying and preparing for the Virginia Board of Pharmacy Controlled Substance Registration and U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration

License for Schedule II-V Controlled Substances and the processes required to resupply its own EMS medications.

- On October 15th, NVEMSC held a meeting of hospital pharmacists and EMS leadership related to the medication transition, and over 40 participants attended. There was good discussion and a request for an additional meeting before the November 27th deadline. Laura will send the invitation for that meeting soon.
- **EMS Next Steps Update**
 - The EMS Next Steps Workgroup has ended its work at the request of Dr. Karen Shelton. A new workgroup may be formed as VDH continues working toward a new vision and structure for OEMS and the regional EMS Councils.
- **EMS Council Designation**
 - The EMS Council Designation packets have been released and are due December 15th.
 - On October 3rd, Laura met with Kristin Nickerson and Andrew Slater from NVERS, as well as Chris Vernovai, Karen Owens, and Tim Perkins from OEMS, to discuss the council designation and considerations for who should submit for the upcoming designation period relative to finalizing the merger of NVEMSC and NVERS.
- **Council Directors reaching out to local legislators**
 - Regional Council Directors are setting up meetings with local legislators, particularly those on the House Appropriations Committee in their region. Laura will be reaching out to agency leaders to join.
- **Annual Audit**
 - The annual audit for FY24 has not yet begun but is expected to start in the next week or two.
- **Council Funding and Annual Assessments**
 - Annual membership assessments went out to all agencies in August, and most have been received.
 - Laura will send reminders to those who are outstanding. Failure to pay membership dues relinquishes your seats on the Council's Board of Directors and any voting rights on Council matters.

STATE AND REGIONAL COMMITTEE REPORTS

Stroke Smart Update

Estee Warring provided the following update:

- With it being fall, there's a community event or festival every weekend. I've capitalized on that by working with event organizers to allow the council to set up a table where I could hand out stroke smart material to those in attendance.
 - Some events have been quite large, with thousands of attendees, and others a little smaller, allowing for more engaging discussions.
 - Through these events, I've distributed over 100 magnets and pens with the Be Fast message.
- I've taught one class with a 55+ community and am working with Loudoun's Medical Reserve Corp to get on their training schedule soon.
- Michelle and I continue to engage in a dialogue with AHA regarding their Get With The Guidelines subscription to determine if it's a product that would benefit the council and ultimately improve patient care in our region.

AHA Training Center

Michelle Ludeman provided the following written report:

- We are excited to announce our region's 2024 EMS Mission: Lifeline Award winners. These awards recognize outstanding EMS agencies that have gone above and beyond to improve heart attack care and save lives. These agencies have demonstrated an unwavering commitment to providing exceptional, evidence-based treatment for heart attack patients, ensuring that those experiencing life-threatening emergencies receive the care they need quickly and effectively.
 - About the Mission: Lifeline Program
 - The American Heart Association's Mission: Lifeline Program is dedicated to improving the care of heart attack patients by fostering seamless integration between EMS and hospital teams. EMS agencies are the first point of contact in the care continuum, rapidly identifying heart attacks, initiating treatment, and ensuring timely handoffs to hospitals for advanced care.
 - The Mission: Lifeline Awards honor EMS agencies that consistently meet national standards for heart attack care, focusing on timely diagnosis, pre-hospital interventions, and collaboration with hospitals to ensure the fastest, most effective treatment.
 - The following EMS agencies have been recognized for their excellence in heart attack care:
 - Arlington County Fire Department
 - City of Fairfax Fire Department
 - City of Manassas Fire and Rescue
- We are scheduled to be monitored by AHA on 11/3/2024 during the HeartCode PALS Course, 0900-1300, at Loudoun County Fire and Rescue Training Academy. I also found out that AHA is only monitoring one discipline.

Rick Cohen advised of the following:

- We haven't met since the last meeting in August; the next meeting is in November

Patient Tracking Workgroup

Jamie Cooper provided the following update on this workgroup.

- Chief Cooper has stepped down as chair of the workgroup.
- Easton Peterson will be the chairperson.
- They will reinvigorate this workgroup. Recently, they had a good meeting at senior operations about vendors, moving the program forward, etc.
- Ask for the group; please be on the lookout for an email for volunteers on this workgroup and its committees. It would be best to have someone from all of the agencies.

Regional Medical Directors & State Medical Direction Committee

Dr. Morgan provided the following update:

- Regional OMD meeting was postponed to 10/24/24.
- The state meeting was held earlier this month in Richmond.
- We don't have a state medical director because Dr. Lindbeck and VDH's contract has fallen through, so he has taken a step back. He checks and answers emails, but not much more. It was asked if there was any interest in changing the contract, for instance, with a healthcare system. It didn't sound like there was much interest to change at this point.
- Discussion on Rx
- Baxter issue and strategic national stockpile and whether to tap that, but no hard decisions.

Training and Certification Committee

Michelle Ludeman provided the following written report:

- Debbie Akers –
 - Debbie reported that they added 30 new Education Coordinators from an EC Institute conducted in Virginia Beach in September. She also reported that they have 282 EC Candidates, with 65 who successfully completed their hours requirements, and 24 are ready for the invitation to the next institute. The deadline for the next institute is December 13. She will be working on the 2025 institute and will update the calendar next week. Debbie advised that there is an update at VPCC (Williamsburg) on Friday, and the last update for 2024 will be held at the SW Higher Ed Center in Abingdon on December 7.
 - Debbie advised that the recert cycle for NREMT is open and they are again accepting the Virginia way for entering CE completion. She will have the update to the Virginia Quick Guide posted on Monday. She also advised the NREMT is allowing CAPCE courses to be automatically updated to provider accounts. She has asked all 3rd party vendor to not do that as it has negative effects on your transcript. She advises that providers who have completed this import should zero out the classes and utilize the Quick Guide for NREMT recertification.
 - Debbie also advised the committee that the High School EMS Program document were approved last meeting was subsequently approved by MDC; however, it remains with VDH for a final review before going to the EMSGAB in November.
- Interim Director – Rachel Stradling –
 - Rachel provided an update on the recruitment of the OEMS Director. They have received 75 applicants. A written exercise has been given to the successfully screened candidates with an expected start to interviews in mid-November. The projected onboarding timeframe will be January 2025. She also advised that they are working to recruit for ACE Division and a Program Rep for Northern Virginia.

- Rachel provided an update on the procurement processes currently underway. She advised that the Office of EMS can no longer support the electronic Patient Care Report system and will be asking for support from TCC for a special initiative grant funding request to the EMSGAB to fund non-profit agencies for 12 months to allow these agencies to work to self-fund their ePCR platform.
- A motion was made and carried “To support the Office of EMS with a special initiative grant funding through the RSAF process to allow agencies to apply for and procure their own ePCR platform, so as long as it is forward facing with the state procured repository for reporting and objectivity.”
- She also advised that the Office was in contract negotiations with Vector Solutions to move the contract from the regional councils back to the state. The current contract expires in November; however, she wanted to make the committee aware that there could be an interruption in service as they navigate VITA requirements.
- Deputy Director of Compliance and Education – Scott Winston provided an update on Chapter 32 Regulatory review process; it is currently in Phase II. Scott also provided a legislative update regarding HB1309, HB1259, and HB933.
 - HB933 was passed and has directed all providers affiliated with an EMS agency to complete training regarding patients with Alzheimer’s and dementia. The committee discussed the necessary training and was advised that all Virginia-approved third-party CE providers have training that meets the intent of HB933 and can be used as such.
- Revision to Auxiliary Program Worksheet—Brian McIntosh—Brian presented a revised Standardized Course CE document that provides a breakdown of authorized CE for standardized courses, initial and refresher, with a clear delineation of pediatric hours for each course. All members were in favor of the motion, and it was carried.
- Peppy Winchel – Peppy discussed a need for training integration across public safety agencies and partners. A discussion occurred identifying training needs and resource map across Virginia. A motion was made by Brian McIntosh requesting the Office of EMS determine the training needs and resources mapping of our current public safety agencies. All members were in favor of the motion and the motion carried.
- Non-agenda New Business – Peppy Winchel – Peppy asked OEMS the status of the training equipment utilized at the EMS Symposium. Rachel Stradling advised that an inventory was ongoing. Peppy asked about the availability of the materials to be used by ECs, agencies, and councils. Rachel advised that they were working on a plan for an equipment library or the ability of agencies to procure the items through the state procurement process.
- Discussion of 2025 Meeting Dates – Matt Lawler – Only change of note is July 20
- Adam Warwick (ODEMSA) - Adam discussed the statistical data, and the data sets provided to Fitch were needed for proper peer review. Adam requested the support of this committee to request the raw data provided to Fitch for analysis. A motion was made by Peppy Winchel to request the data sets provided by OEMS that were used in the Fitch report. All members were in favor of the motion, and the motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Merger with NVERS

- Nate advised that the merger is progressing, and Kristin and Andrew are working closely with Laura to move it forward.

- Tom Olander asked about legal counsel and some confusion about the vote in August being overturned.
 - Justin Nelson asked why the vote was overturned because it did pass based on simple majority rules.
 - Laura discussed the concern that was raised. Due to differing interpretations, the Council sought out a professional parliamentarian to review the circumstances and provide guidance.
 - Since NVEMSC bylaws say the majority of those present and not “the majority of those present and voting,” it must be greater than 50% of the directors present that day, and our bylaws overrule Roberts Rules of Order. Since there were 25 directors present, it would require 13 or more YES votes to pass. Since there were only 12 yes votes, it did not pass, and therefore, a letter was sent to all directors to notify them of the correction.
- Jamie Cooper stated that when you merge two entities, both entities should have separate, appropriate legal representation. Since the motion failed last time, we should re-vote on the matter.
 - **Chief Cooper made a motion for "NVEMS Council to obtain legal representation during the merger between them and NVERS."**
 - **Rick Cohen seconded the motion.**
 - Discussion on the motion –
 - Chief Cooper stated that businesses do not go through any type of corporate merger without legal representation for both entities. It's not punitive, just to protect everyone.
 - David Wielgosz and Chris Granger asked if there was any consideration for an amount to spend or not to exceed.
 - There was no amount placed on this motion with the recommendation that the intent is to have legal counsel for NVEMSC review the final merger documents before they are executed and signed. With this, it should be significantly cheaper than having an attorney review each step and mediate each part.
 - Justin Nelson stated that the original ask was for due diligence at the end to ensure we're protected, each side is transparent on what they want, and the expectations are met across the board.
 - Beth Adams asked for clarification on whether we are just seeking an attorney licensed in VA or one specializing in contract law
 - Friendly amendment to add the specification contract attorney. "NVEMS Council to have legal representation for the merger between NVEMS and NVERS and have it reviewed by an attorney knowledgeable in contract law."
 - Vote 20 Yes, 3 Abstain
 - ***The motion passed***
- Byron Andrews asked if there would be a presentation to the board to show the directors how this would all look.
 - Nate Strong advised that there will be, and we'll have NVERS present to walk us through it.
