The meeting was started at 10:05 am by Craig Evans.

PRESENTATIONS:

Dr. Pankajavalli Ramakrishnan from Riverside Neurovascular Specialists in Newport News, Virginia, presented "EMS Driven Stroke Triage in Virginia" using data from Peninsulas EMS Council with the use of the RACE stroke triage tool. She discussed educating providers in the

PEMS Council region on RACE and how providers were more confident in calling a LVO stroke and then taking their patients to the appropriate stroke centers. She also discussed the 2018 AHA/ASA guidelines on acute large vessel occlusion stroke treatment.

Dr. Venu Vadlamudi from Inova Loudoun Hospital presented Inova's proposed stroke triage plan recommending diversion to a comprehensive stroke center within 30 minutes of positive stroke scale signs and indication of large vessel occlusion. The group discussed making this a regional guideline, not just for Inova, and how to adapt it to fit every Fire and EMS agencies needs since not everyone uses the same stroke scale and some are not interested in changing from their current method.

Craig Evans asked how we move forward as a region with this. He discussed that he has spoken with John Dugan from the AHA and Mission: Lifeline about getting regional stroke data just as we do STEMI data. This will depend on everyone using Get with the Guidelines: Stroke. This is coming forward and he will provide information to the group as it becomes available. Craig also discussed the Stroke Triage Plan and how we promote stroke care in the region. Dr. Avstreich asked if the neurology colleagues in the room could discuss whether it is necessary for every agency to use the same stroke triage scale. Dr. Vadlamudi stated that while using the same scale across agencies would provide powerful numbers on our actual stroke care in the region, the reality is that we won't be able to get everyone on the same page and everyone should just use the highest score as their defining point for transport to the comprehensive centers.

Dr. Duane Campbell advised that there will be new data in 2019 that will likely publish two stroke scales in 2020 and possibly two more two years later, but it will be a more rigid protocol than we have now. Dr. Avstreich advised that we can't continue to change the scales and rules regularly or EMS won't be able to keep up. Rick Bonnett pointed out that with the appropriate training and information, EMS providers will be able to learn the information that is mandated by their departments but not everyone has the same amount of personnel to do that with and that is the challenge for some. Kate Kramer stated that if we continually change our scales, no providers will actually become and remain proficient. Hillary Dussler advised that they are fortunate enough to be close to Inova Alexandria Hospital and take all of their patients there, but their OMD Dr. Marfori and EMS Chief Brian Hricik advised that they have no intention of training off the Cincinnati Stroke Scale because it works well for them and their providers can remain proficiency.

Dr. Campbell also mentioned that it is worth tracking door to needle times, door to balloon times and triage efficacy and share that information amongst the group.

The next meeting will be held June 5, 2018, at the same location. An invitation and reminder will be sent to all.

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The meeting was adjourned at 12:18 pm.
